3 The Fishery

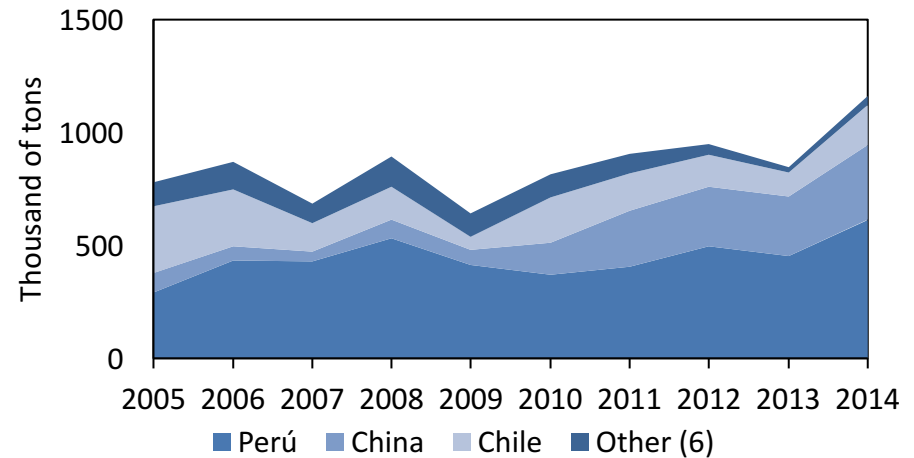
Jumbo squid



- Biggest artisanal fishery in Peru
- World largest squid fishery
- Landings (2015): 514 thousand tons
- More than 11 thousand fishermen
- More than 3 thousand fishing vessels

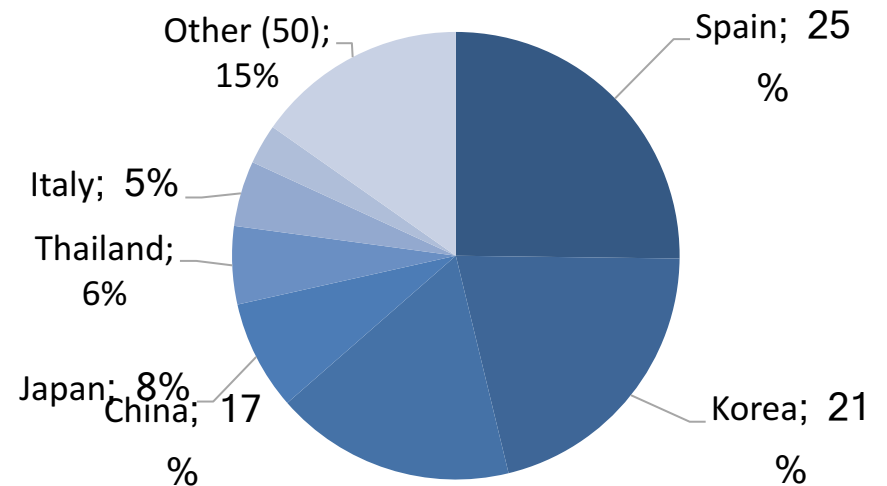
Official Peruvian data

3 The Fishery

Main deficiencies known today.

1. Fleet is not formalised. Need to identify and regularise the fleet (3-4 thousand vessels)
2. Poor fleet data gathering. Need to develop a data collection system to improve fishery monitoring
3. Need to improve stock assessment methodology by providing technical support to IMARPE
4. Transboundary Stock. Need to improve cooperation with other nations and also at RFMO level.

1, 2 & 3 enable an efficient management system

4 Peruvian Jumbo Flying Squid FIP

Objective

Move the fishery from the actual situation to a point where it can be MSC certified by using the FIP methodology agreed under the Conservation Alliance for Seafood Solutions.

Two types of FIPS

BASIC

Good entry point for fisheries to begin addressing specific environmental challenges.

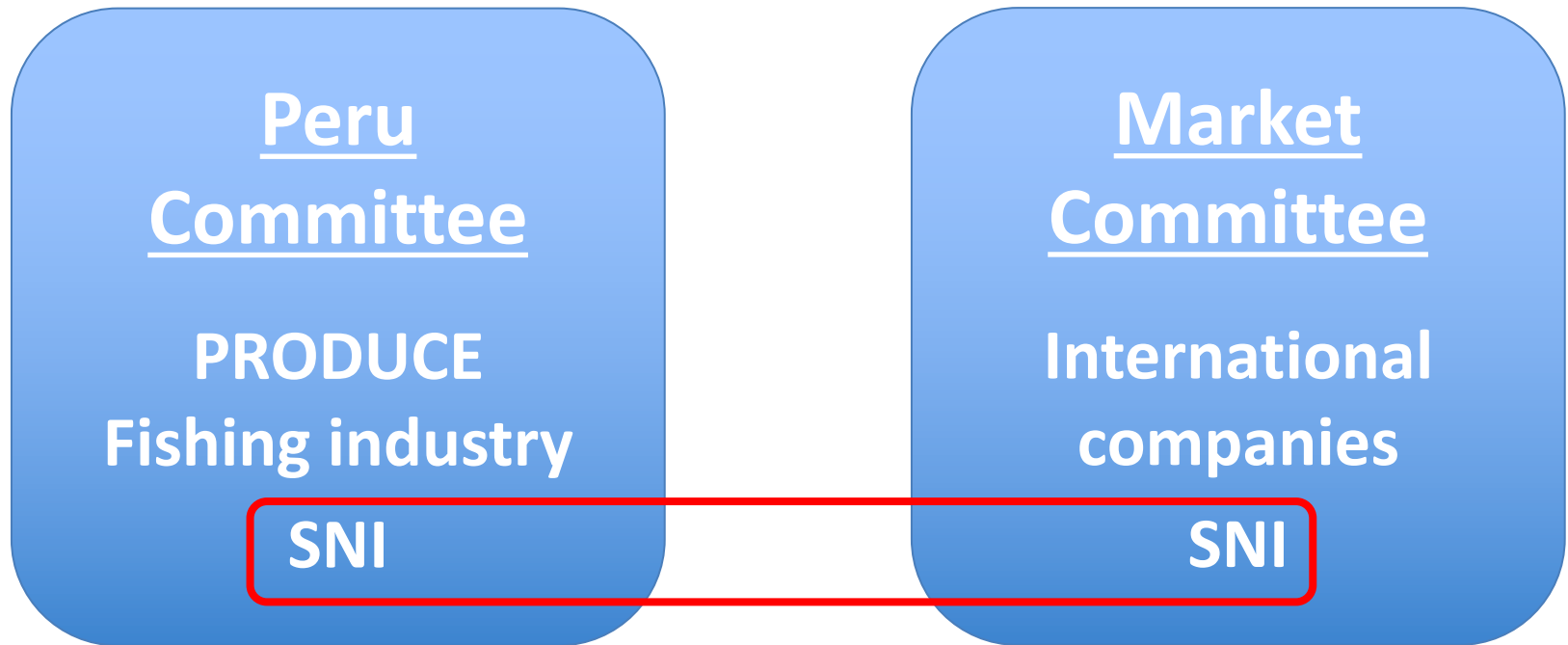
COMPREHENSIVE

Aim to address the full range of environmental challenges necessary for a fishery to achieve a high level of sustainability.

Roles and responsibilities

Peru committee; actual implementation of the actions defined in the work plan. WWF Peru coordination.

Market committee; provide support to the Peru committee to find solutions that allow to overcome the difficulties found during implementation. SFP coordination.

4 Peruvian Jumbo Flying Squid FIP

February '17 – Seed funding was secured to start and take steps 1 and 2 of the FIP comprehensive process



2nd quarter 2017

4 Peruvian Jumbo Flying Squid FIP

Starting now as Basic FIP but will move into comprehensive once the work-plan has been finalized.

Basic FIP:

1. Improve stock assessment
2. Fleet formalization
3. Improve data gathering

Basic FIP stage next steps

1. MOU agreement and signed Brussels 2017
 1. *SIN - Fishermen Associations - Produce*
 2. *SIN – FESBA – CONGALSA – CABOMAR – DAVIGEL - PANAPESCA USA*
2. Basic FIP workplan desing; ongoing
3. FIP stakeholders agreement on workplan activities roles and needs (3rd quarter 2017)
4. Fisheryprogress.org (3rd quarter 2017)
